CAMPUS SCHOLARSHIPS

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At Grand Canyon University, we offer generous scholarship opportunities to help make a private Christian education affordable. On average, a student qualifies for approximately \$7,900* in GCU-funded scholarships for the academic year, which reduces overall tuition by nearly half. We have proudly maintained this traditional campus rate for 13 years and our frozen tuition will continue to remain steady in 2021-22.

In 2020, GCU's campus students received over \$157 million in scholarships. To maintain a GCU-funded institutional scholarship each year, students must be an admitted campus traditional undergraduate student and meet scholarship requirements. The following GCU-funded academic scholarships are renewable annually and can be locked in for up to four years for most programs. Visit **gcu.edu/CampusScholarships** for more information.

High School Academic Scholarship Program

High school student scholarships are based on their weighted high school GPA. If they do not have a weighted GPA, they can apply their unweighted GPA (minimum of 2.5 GPA) plus ACT or SAT test score.

Indirect Academic Scholarship Program

Transfer, GAP Year and High School International F-1 Visa Students

Students who are enrolling with GCU and are not eligible for the high school academic scholarship program (enrolled at GCU the semester following high school graduation), or students who are attending with an International F-1 Visa may be eligible for a transfer scholarship. A transfer scholarship is based on a student's unweighted high school GPA, their cumulative college transfer GPA if they have six or more college credits, or their ACT/SAT scores. ACT/SAT scores require a minimum 2.5 unweighted high school GPA.

* Average tuition after scholarships is approximately \$8,600. Scholarships may be awarded based on 6th semester transcripts. At the time in which final, official transcripts are received, GCU reserves the right to rescind or modify the scholarship if it is determined that eligibility was not achieved. GCU reserves the right to decline scholarship awards for any reason. If a student does not meet the minimum renewal criteria, their scholarship will be forfeited. GCU reserves the right to change scholarship awards at any time without notice. Prices based on 2019-20 rate and are subject to change.

** The Chancellor award is the only scholarship level that requires an unweighted GPA for eligibility. There are a limited number of Chancellor awards and they are available on a first-come, first-serve basis.
* If the student is admitted based on ACT or SAT, they will need a minimum unweighted high school GPA of 2.5 to be awarded the scholarship.

ADDITIONAL GCU SCHOLARSHIPS

Priority Registration Award This program awards scholarships from \$200 – \$800 per academic year based on the number of awards available at the time of registration and whether students live on or off campus. This award is renewable annually for the fall and spring, up to eight semesters. There are a limited number of Priority Registration Awards and all requirements for registration and attendance must be met to receive this award.

Grand Canyon University Award (in-state and out-of-state)

This program awards \$1,000 per academic year to Arizona students and \$250 to out-of-state students who graduate from one of GCU's participant high schools. Students attending one of the Maricopa County Community College campuses must have earned an associate degree or equivalent for the award. This award is renewable annually for fall and spring, up to eight semesters. This award cannot be combined with the Canyon Christian Schools Consortium Award.

Canyon Christian Schools Consortium (CCSC) Award

This program awards the following amounts to students who graduate from a CCSC participant school and are under the age of 21 by the first day of the student's first semester:

- ▶ \$4,000 per academic year to on-campus students
- \$1,500 per academic year to off-campus students

Students who have graduated from a CCSC participant school prior to the contract signing date, and are at least 21 years of age, but under the age of 23, may qualify for the following amounts:

- \$3,000 per academic year to on-campus students
- ▶ \$1,000 per academic year to off-campus students

These awards are renewable for fall and spring terms based on the number of years the student attended the CCSC participant school In order to renew, the student must maintain admissibility, attend a campus worship service weekly and meet the 20-hour service requirement each semester, as determined by the university. Recipients of the CCSC award are ineligible for the Grand Canyon University Award.



ADDITIONAL GCU SCHOLARSHIPS CONTINUED

CSET Award (Programmatic award for computer science, computer programming, information technology and engineering majors)

This program awards \$500 per academic year to students who enroll in one of the following programs: computer science, computer programming, information technology or engineering. This award is renewable annually for fall and spring, up to eight semesters and as long as the student stays enrolled in a qualified CSET award program at GCU. There are a limited number of awards and they are available on a first-come, first-serve basis. This award cannot be combined with the Phi Theta Kappa Award or the Psi Beta Award.

Phi Theta Kappa and Psi Beta Awards

This program awards \$1,000 per academic year to students who are a current member of Phi Theta Kappa or Psi Beta and have a 3.5 or greater cumulative weighted college GPA. These awards are renewable annually for the fall and spring, up to eight semesters. These awards are available on a first-come, first-serve basis and cannot be combined with each other or the CSET Award.
