



Grand Canyon University is Arizona's premier, private Christian university. CAMPUS SCHOLARSHIPS

At Grand Canyon University, we offer generous scholarship opportunities to help make a private Christian education affordable. The average campus student pays \$8,900² in annual tuition, which reduces overall tuition by nearly half.

To maintain a GCU-funded institutional scholarship each year, students must be an admitted campus traditional undergraduate student and meet scholarship requirements. HIGH SCHOOL ACADEMIC SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

High school student scholarships are based on their weighted high school GPA. If they do not have a weighted GPA, they can apply their unweighted GPA (minimum of 2.5 GPA) plus ACT or SAT test score.

INDIRECT ACADEMIC SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

Transfer, GAP Year and High School International F-1 Visa Students

Students who are enrolling with GCU and are not eligible for the high school academic scholarship program (enrolled at GCU the semester following high school graduation), or students who are attending with an International F-1 Visa may be eligible for a transfer scholarship. A transfer scholarship is based on a student's unweighted high school GPA, their cumulative college transfer GPA if they have six or more college credits, or their ACT/SAT scores. ACT/SAT scores require a minimum 2.5 unweighted high school GPA.

¹The Chancellor Award scholarship level requires an unweighted GPA for eligibility.

GCU academic scholarships and institutional aid may be combined up to the following limits:

- i. Chancellor/Chancellor-IB/President's Scholarship in campus housing up to \$15,000
- ii. All other scholars in campus housing up to \$12,500
- iii. All scholars living off campus up to \$10,000

iv. Micro-scholarships may not be combined with any other form of GCU-funded institutional aid or scholarships. Microscholarships may replace GCU institutional aid — up to \$6,000 per academic year. Athletic scholarships, Critical Mass scholarships and some student life leadership positions are not subject to the limits above (ASGCU and RA scholarships).

² If the student is admitted based on ACT or SAT, they will need a minimum unweighted high school GPA of 2.5 to be awarded the scholarship.

³ If the students test date was before March 1, 2016, please find more information on requirements at gcu.edu/CampusScholarships.

⁴ Students who are not fully admissible to GCU and are accepted with specifications may be eligible for GCU institutional scholarships if they have an unweighted high school GPA of 2.8-2.99. Scholarships that are awarded off of the students weighted GPA will be honored regardless of admissibility status. Students entering GCU that are not fully admissible to GCU with an unweighted GPA of 2.79 or lower are not eligible for this scholarship program.
