### FIND YOUR PURPOSE

<sup>1</sup>This award offers up to \$4,000 per academic year students who graduate from one of GCU's CCSC participant high schools. The student must have attended the CCSC school all four years and have an unweighted GPA of 2.5 or higher. Qualified Students must be enrolled for 12 or more credit hours for each semester and be under the age of 21 by the start of their first semester at GCU. If the student did not attend all 4 years, the scholarship amount will be prorated based on the number of semesters the student completed at the CCSC high school. The student must graduate from the CCSC high school to receive the scholarship. Students over the age of 21 but under the age of 23 at the time of starting coursework with GCU may be eligible for a reduced CCSC award amount. This award is renewable annually for fall and spring semesters for up to eight semesters if the student maintains continuous full-time enrollment, joins a campus worship service weekly and meets the 20-hour community service project requirement each semester (40 hours per academic year), upholds the ethical and moral values by which GCU stands and maintains admissibility with GCU. Recipients of the CCSC award are ineligible for the Grand Canyon State Scholarship. This scholarship is subject to the Grand Canyon University CAP policy and cannot exceed your charges. Award and award amounts are based on the 2024-25 award year. This scholarship is only available for traditional, undergraduate on-campus students.

<sup>2</sup> The Chancellor Award scholarship level requires an unweighted GPA for eligibility.

<sup>3</sup> If the student is admitted based on ACT or SAT, they will need a minimum unweighted high school GPA of 2.5 to be awarded the scholarship.
