

ON CAMPUS

Chapel, The Gathering and Life Groups meet on a weekly basis.

Chapel is led collaboratively by Spiritual Life staff, our University Pastor and student worship teams. It is open to all students, staff and faculty. It is an environment where the GCU community comes together to pray, worship and hear biblical teachings from local pastors.

The Gathering is an evening service led by students with oversight from Spiritual Life staff. It incorporates student leadership into an environment where the student body can connect and grow as they hear from God's Word, pray for one another and worship together.

Life Groups are student-led Bible studies for residential and commuter students. There are more than 200 Life Groups that meet each week. Students are welcome to join a Life Group at any time throughout the year.

LOCAL OUTREACH MINISTRY

Student leaders and staff from the Department of Spiritual Life organize a variety of annual and weekly outreach ministry events to serve and support GCU's surrounding community. Here are just a few:

Habitat for Humanity

GCU has partnered with Habitat for Humanity, a nonprofit Christian housing ministry that builds and repairs houses all over the world for underprivileged people, to renovate an entire community of homes in our West Phoenix neighborhood. GCU is committing the talent and enthusiasm of students and employees who have paired with Habitat leaders to supply the manpower necessary to renovate as many as 700 neighborhood homes.

Serve the City

This volunteer service day inspires students and staff to work together to help improve GCU's surrounding neighborhoods. Previous projects have transformed local homes, schools and churches. GCU's high-profile partnerships with Habitat for Humanity and CityServe have resulted in over 800 local home repairs and thousands of boxes of food distributed to families in need.

Canyon Kids

Every Saturday morning, Canyon Kids—a student-run ministry through the Spiritual Life Department—invites the children in our neighborhood to Little Canyon Park for Bible stories, games and crafts. Volunteers have the opportunity to mentor and form spiritual relationships with kids from the local community.

Homeless Ministry

GCU has partnered with St. Vincent de Paul to provide assistance to families in need. Opportunities include serving meals and helping maintain their garden, along with other programming, meal and tutoring aid for under-resourced children whose families visit the center.

Youth Outreach

The GCU Youth Outreach team meets each week on campus with kids from the Canyon Corridor neighborhood. The goal of Youth Outreach is to establish mentoring relationships with middle school and high school students.





Each year, GCU students and faculty embark on global outreach trips in order to be in an environment where the Lord opens their heart to serve people of all nations. Mission trips vary in focus; some serve children and the homeless or focus on medical needs, while others are labor-intensive construction projects. GCU provides opportunities for students to participate in both short trips and longer voyages in order to reap the benefits of multiple experiences in ministering abroad.

Recent mission trip locations include:



In the fall, the Department of Spiritual Life hosts a mission fair where local churches and organizations provide opportunities for students to join a mission trip team.
