NURSING (BSN) PRE-LICENSURE

GCU's Pre-Licensure BSN degree readies graduates to practice as generalist registered nurses, enabling them to work across all areas of health care. This program consists of two years of prerequisite coursework followed by a secondary application into the clinical program based on available seats. Curriculum and course work are designed to help students in the clinical setting and to prepare for the National Council Licensure Examination (NCLEX-RN®).

GCU's Bachelor of Science in Nursing: Pre-Licensure is only available to incoming high school students.



Pre-Nursing PATHWAY5

Pre-Nursing Traditional Campus

BSN PATHWAY

Students taking the pre-nursing traditional campus route will attend all pre-requisite classes on GCU's campus in Phoenix. Upon secondary admittance into GCU's nursing program, students will attend 16 months of continuous classes. This will include attending hands-on skills labs, immersive simulation, theory and clinicals with the guidance of knowledgeable faculty who can help ensure students are prepared for the nursing profession. Students can graduate with their BSN and be eligible to sit for the NCI FX-RN exam.



ABSN PATHWAY

Students who choose the pre-nursing online route can enter as a zero-credit freshman or as a transfer student and must meet minimum program requirements. They may complete their remaining general education credits and nursing pre-requisites online through GCU prior to applying for secondary admittance into GCU's 16-month ABSN program. Students choosing this route are not eligible for secondary acceptance to the traditional ground campus Pre-Licensure BSN program.

Pre-Nursing Campus Residential



ABSN PATHWAY

Students who choose the pre-nursing campus residential route can enter as a zero-credit freshman or as a transfer student and must meet minimum program requirements. They may complete their remaining general education credits and nursing pre-requisites in-person on the GCU campus (so long as they live on campus and meet eligibility requirements to do so) prior to applying for secondary admittance into GCU's 16-month ABSN program. Students choosing this route are not eligible for secondary acceptance to the traditional ground campus Pre-Licensure BSN program. Learn more about pre-nursing programs at gcu.edu/nursing

Secondary Applicants must transfer a minimum of 60 of the required 123 credits or have completed a baccalaureate degree which includes nine prerequisite courses/labs and 10 general education courses prior to starting the core nursing courses, which can be completed in as few as 16 months. Direct Entry Applicants that do not transfer 60 credits but meet the minimum requirements can complete these credits through GCU prior to starting the core nursing courses. Depending on the state where student has enrolled or intends to complete the program, student may require additional courses. This may include, but is not limited to, additional general education courses, courses in the major, clinical courses, or a different course sequence. See University Policy Handbook.

¹ Travel reimbursement is only available to students who demonstrate their ability to meet admissibility for the traditional campus, plus one legal guardian, from a student's home city/state to Phoenix, AZ. School/district/organizations staff, faculty and/or personnel are also eligible. To participate, the program requires a signed MOU by both the student and parent/guardian or personnel, approval of travel dates by GCU and receipts submitted per GCU requirements. Travel reimbursement thresholds vary based on location and education sector. Only one form of travel will be reimbursed, air or ground. GCU does not reimburse hotel expenses, baggage costs, early check-in or travel insurance fees. Travel reimbursement usually occurs within 45 days.
