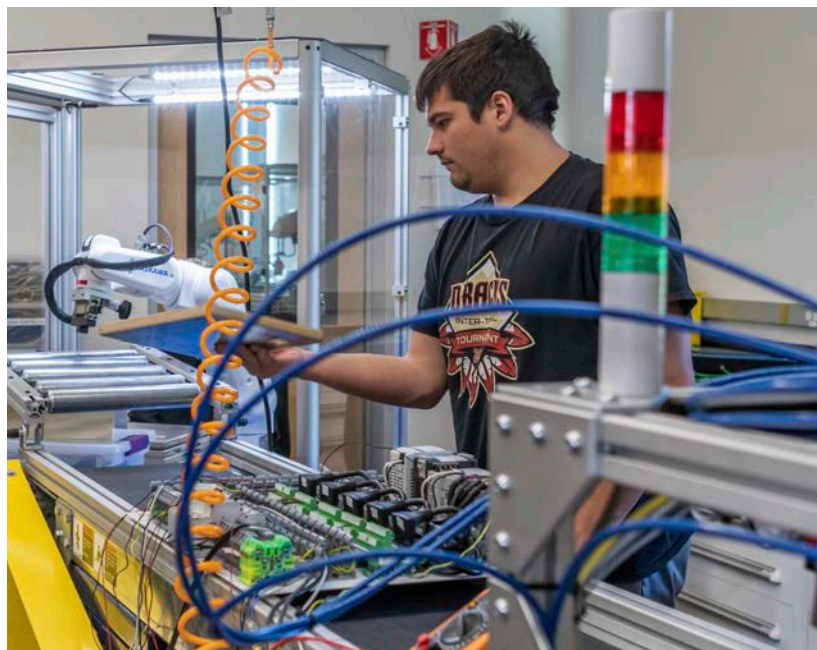

Here at GCU, our number one priority is our students. This is why we do everything in our power to make it affordable for them to receive a quality education.

FINANCIAL TRANSPARENCY

As a university that upholds financial transparency, our admissions counselors offer detailed information and benefits and answer questions directly about how to pay for college and incur minimal debt.

GCU takes great care to ensure students know how much attending GCU will cost so they can make the necessary plans early in the college search process.

Our university counselors help families determine which scholarship opportunities students may be eligible to receive. We make sure families understand the requirements, cost savings and how to lock in a scholarship offer.



MINIMIZE STUDENT LOAN DEBT

Our university admissions counselors provide financial solutions and options tailored to each student's unique financial situation. We're committed to helping students graduate with minimal student debt by offering interest-free payment plans that begin with transparent financial discussions.




RESIDENCE LIFE

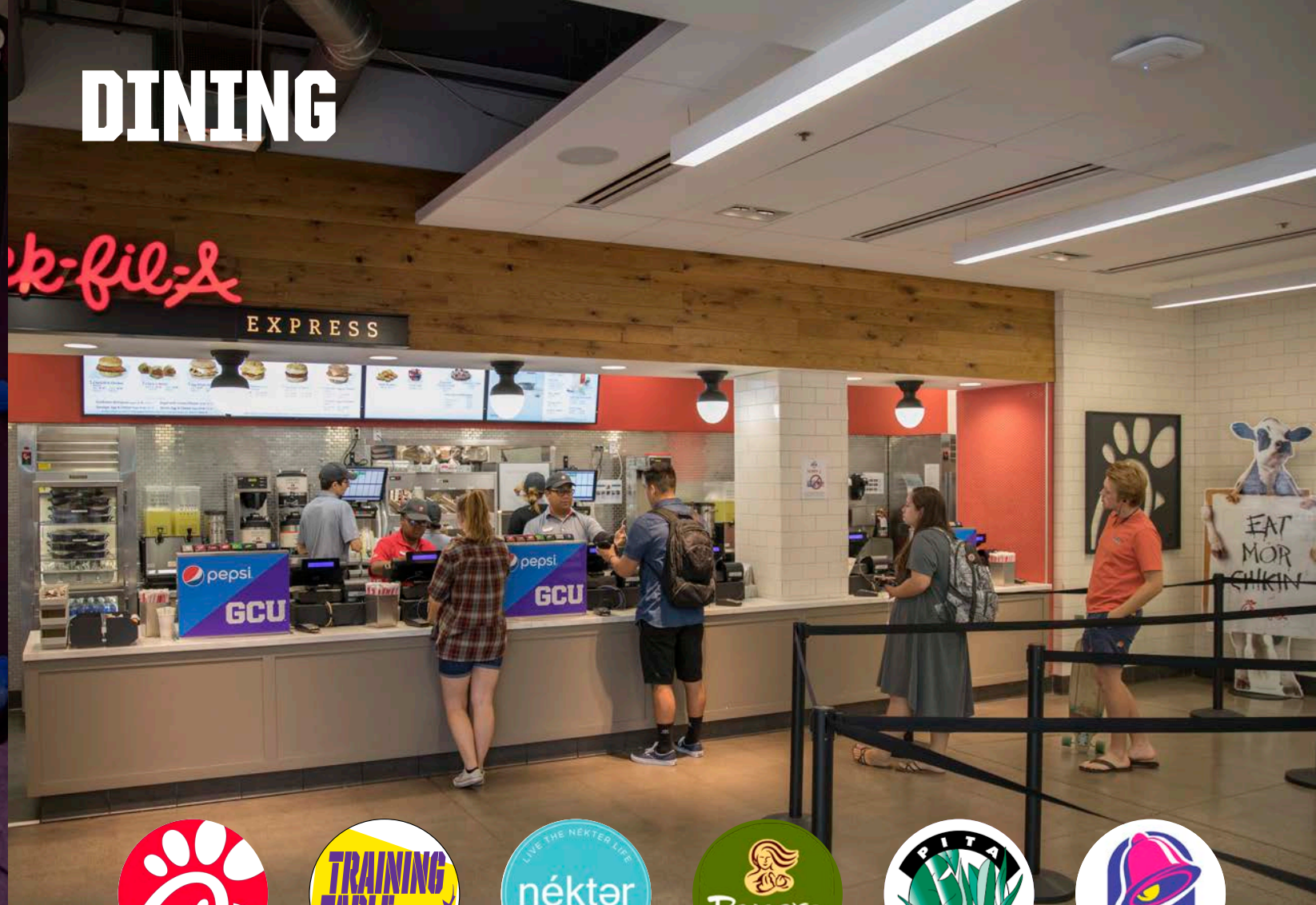

GCU OUTDOOR RECREATION PROGRAM

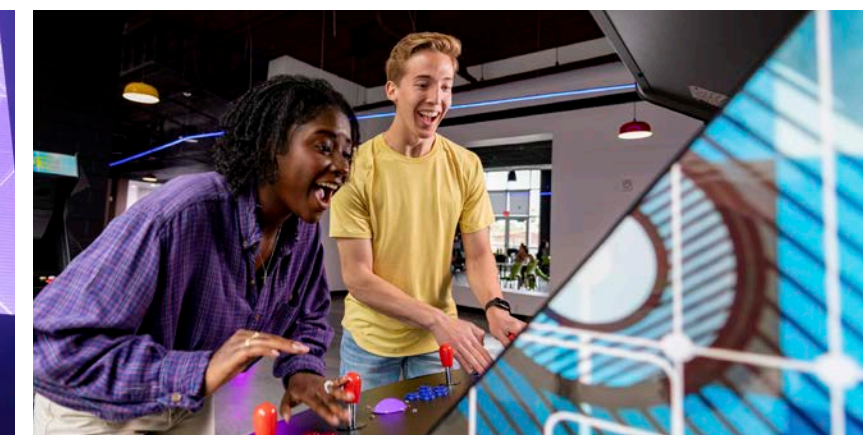
Provides students with outdoor recreation and adventure opportunities that nurture fellowship, environmental stewardship, leadership development and outdoor education.

FITNESS AND RECREATION

Students have access to intramural fields, basketball courts, tennis courts, multiple modern fitness facilities and a beautiful walking path surrounding campus to play, work out or just relax with your friends.

LOCAL AND GLOBAL OUTREACH

Student leaders and staff from the Department of Spiritual Life organize a variety of annual and weekly outreach ministry events to serve and support GCU's surrounding community. Here are just a few:

- **CITYSERVE** GCU is proud to partner with CityServe – a network of churches and community service organizations dedicated to transforming communities. In September 2021, GCU took on the role of CityServe's official distribution HUB for Arizona, distributing in-kind goods from furniture to small appliances supplied by national retailers to families in need across our state.
- **CANYON KIDS** Our students host children from the surrounding neighborhood in Little Canyon Park and Cielito Park for Bible stories, games, crafts and more. These volunteers mentor and bring joy to these children to help create a safe environment.
- **HABITAT FOR HUMANITY** Since 2015, GCU volunteers have been revitalizing local neighborhoods and positively impacting West Phoenix families by renovating and building homes as part of GCU's unprecedented partnership with Habitat for Humanity.
- **HOMELESS MINISTRY** GCU has partnered with St. Vincent de Paul to provide assistance to families in need. Opportunities include serving meals and helping maintain the garden at the facility, along with other programs and tutoring aid for under-resourced children whose families visit the center.

Our progressive athletics program brings the GCU campus and community together—and our game days are unlike any other. Excitement throughout the community is led by the Havocs, a spirited student section that always brings the thunder to sporting events. This student spirit club also gives back to the community through Havocs with Heart by participating in nonprofit organizations in Phoenix.

GCU has a rich history of athletic success including eight National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA) national championships and back-to-back Learfield Directors' Cups in 2011-12 and 2012-13 as the top-performing NCAA Division II athletics department. In 2017, GCU completed its four-year transition to the most elite level of intercollegiate athletics — NCAA Division I.

As a D1 school in the Western Athletic Conference (WAC), GCU has won three Commissioner's Cups for the conference's most successful school competitively and two Academic Excellence Awards as the WAC's top department academically. The Lopes have made many appearances in the NCAA Tournament including men's basketball, baseball and men's and women's soccer.

¹ Travel reimbursement is only available to accepted prospective traditional campus students, plus one legal guardian, from a student's home city/state to Phoenix, AZ. School/district/organizations staff, faculty and/or personnel are also eligible. To participate, the program requires a signed MOU by both the student and parent/guardian or personnel, approval of travel dates by GCU and receipts submitted per GCU requirements. Travel reimbursement thresholds vary based on location and education sector. Only one form of travel will be reimbursed, air or ground. GCU does not reimburse hotel expenses, baggage costs, early check-in or travel insurance fees. Travel reimbursement usually occurs within 45 days.
