Students of all levels, including those not majoring in the arts, are eligible to participate in theatre productions. Unlike many university productions, first year students have frequently been cast, even in leading roles!

GCU BANDS

GCU offers three different band performance ensembles designed to give students an opportunity to continue playing throughout their college days, no matter their major. The Thundering Heard Pep Band performs in support of GCU athletic and promotional events on and off campus. The GCU Wind Ensemble performs the finest concert literature and chamber music and the GCU Thunder Big Band is our jazz band.

GCU CHOIRS

GCU has two on-campus choirs: Canyon Choral Society and Canyon Chorale. Students of any major are welcome to join and perform in the **Ethington Music Concert Series**.

GCU STRING ENSEMBLE

The GCU String Ensemble currently performs smaller chamber works but is growing towards becoming a GCU Orchestra. Students with string experience who wish to perform in college should consider joining.







- Black Box Theatre GCU has transformed this dynamic venue into a versatile creative lab and performance space to help students develop their sound design and theatrical lighting skills.
- **Choir, Orchestra and Band** have a dedicated rehearsal room and instrument storage area in Bldg 58-158. We have 14 individual practice rooms, many of which are equipped with pianos.
- **Dance Studios** GCU has multiple dance studios and music rehearsal spaces across campus.
- Editing Lab is equipped with iMac desktops, offering film students a space to complete projects and assignments.
- **GCU Ad Agency** prepares students for careers in advertising and marketing by offering them experience in an actual agency setting.
- **GCU Design Studio** students have a space to work on skills such as figure drawing, animation and sculpting.
- **Recording Labs** Our recording labs and whisper rooms, are ideal for voice-over work, music production or podcast recording.

BLACKMAGIC DESIGN TRAINING

As a Blackmagic Design Training Partner, GCU hosts in-person training on DaVinci Resolve 15, a professional non-linear editing system with cutting-edge color correction capabilities and an Advanced Fairlight audio system. Once the classroom training is completed, individuals are able to take an online exam to become certified.

¹Travel reimbursement is only available to accepted prospective traditional campus students, plus one legal guardian, from a student's home city/state to Phoenix, AZ. School/district/organizations staff, faculty and/or personnel are also eligible. To participate, the program requires a signed MOU by both the student and parent/guardian or personnel, approval of travel dates by GCU and receipts submitted per GCU requirements. Travel reimbursement thresholds vary based on location and education sector. Only one form of travel will be reimbursed, air or ground. GCU does not reimburse hotel expenses, baggage costs, early check-in or travel insurance fees. Travel reimbursement usually occurs within 45 days.

Grand Canyon University is accredited by the Higher Learning Commission (hlcommission.org), an institutional accreditation agency recognized by the U.S. Department of Education. Please note, not all GCU programs are available in all states and in all learning modalities. Program availability is contingent on student enrollment. Pre-licensure nursing students who begin or resume attendance in Fall 2020 and beyond will be ineligible to utilize most GCU institutional aid/scholarships for tuition and fees once accepted into the clinical portion of the program.
