NEW STUDENT CLASSIFICATIONS

NEW STUDENT (AGES 17 - 19)

- A minimum of 17-years-old at the start of the academic term and under 20 years old on Dec. 31
- Registered as a full-time undergraduate student (12 or more credits, at least eight of which must be taken on campus)

NEW STUDENT (AGES 20-25)

- A minimum of 20-years-old by Dec. 31 and younger than 26-years-old at the start of the academic term
- Registered as a full-time undergraduate student (12 or more credits, at least eight of which must be taken on campus)





SUITE-STYLE LIVING OPTIONS: SINGLE, DOUBLE AND TRIPLE OCCUPANCY

SINGLE OCCUPANCY SUITE-STYLE APARTMENTS

Student will have their own bedroom but will share a bathroom with one other student. Includes kitchen equipped with refrigerator, freezer, oven and electric range top and microwave.

SUITE-STYLE RESIDENCE HALLS -DOUBLE AND TRIPLE OCCUPANCY

Students share a bedroom and bathroom with one to two direct roommates and share the entire space with two to five suitemates, depending upon their occupancy selection. Double occupancy suites are shared by four students and triple occupancy suites are shared by six.

Room and board rates start at just \$3,800 per semester.¹

SUPPORT SERVICES

Resident Director

Resident directors (RDs) are full-time, professional live-in staff members who provide leadership and supervision for the resident assistants.

Resident Assistant¹

Resident assistants (RAs) are student leaders handpicked by the Residence Life staff to serve in every living area to help foster community, create accountability for university living area policies and act as a resource to residential students.

Life Leader¹

Life leaders are students within each living area who serve as a resource, offering support and spiritual formation opportunities for residents.

Public Safety

Our Public Safety team is made up of real police officers and GCU Public Safety employees, including a large team of student workers. By working together, they provide assistance to students and help to ensure our campus is safe 24 hours a day, seven days a week.

Facilities

Our amazing facilities employees keep our large campus beautiful. Students are able to put in requests to the facilities department to repair anything in their room or suite that breaks throughout the year. Facilities employees also keep our classrooms and common areas clean.

SAFETY Campus safety is a top priority and GCU takes every step to

protect the GCU community and our properties 24/7, starting with the Department of Public Safety. Our safe, tight-knit community is patrolled by the Grand Canyon University Police Department.

We have various systems in place, including:

- An incident reporting system (TIPS)
- A safety escort service
- **Emergency blue light phones**
- R.A.V.E emergency text notification
- AlertGCU for communicating timesensitive information during an emergency
