
WE WILL PREPARE students to be contributing citizens in a diverse global community by facilitating service to others.

SPIRITUAL LIFE

GCU strives to foster an environment where all students are encouraged to explore and strengthen their faith. Our goal is to equip students to develop spiritually and provide opportunities to examine and utilize the gifts and passions God has given them. We want students to learn how to lead others in a way that honors and demonstrates their commitment to Jesus. GCU is also strongly committed to serving others on a local, national and global level, and students are invited to participate on short-term mission trips and a variety of weekly outreach ministries.

ON-CAMPUS

Chapel, The Gathering and Life Groups meet on a weekly basis.

CHAPEL is a weekly worship service that invites the GCU community to join together to pray, sing and hear biblical teachings from local pastors, ministry leaders and special guests. Services are led collaboratively by student leaders, Spiritual Life staff and our campus pastor, and is open to all students, staff and faculty.

THE GATHERING is a weekly evening worship service led by student leaders with oversight from Spiritual Life staff. Students are invited to join their peers in community, prayer, worship and Bible teaching led by the GCU Pastoral Team.

LIFE GROUPS are student-led Bible studies for residential and commuter students. New students are especially encouraged to participate in Life Groups to meet friends and be encouraged with times of prayer and discussion. Students are welcome to join a Life Group any time throughout the year.

SPIRITUAL FORMATION workshops are weekly opportunities to learn and practice spiritual disciplines. Students grow in their understanding of biblical topics such as prayer, reading scripture, rest and more.

LOCAL OUTREACH MINISTRY

Student leaders and staff from the Department of Spiritual Life organize a variety of annual and weekly outreach ministry events to serve and support GCU's surrounding community. Here are just a few:

CANYON KIDS

Every Saturday morning, Canyon Kids invites the children in our neighborhood to a local church for Bible stories, games and crafts. Volunteers have the opportunity to mentor and form spiritual relationships with kids from the local community.

CITYSERVE

GCU is proud to partner with CityServe – a network of churches and community service organizations dedicated to transforming communities. After the official opening of a 35,000 square foot warehouse in September 2021, GCU took on the role of CityServe's official distribution HUB for Arizona. Since then, in-kind goods from furniture to small appliances supplied by national retailers (Costco. Amazon, etc.) have been distributed regularly to families in need across our state.

HABITAT FOR HUMANITY

GCU has partnered with Habitat for Humanity, a nonprofit Christian housing ministry that builds and repairs houses all over the world for underprivileged people, to renovate an entire community of homes in our West Phoenix neighborhood. GCU is committing the talent and enthusiasm of students and employees who have paired with Habitat leaders to supply the manpower necessary to renovate as many as 700 neighborhood homes.

HOMELESS MINISTRY

GCU has partnered with St. Vincent de Paul to provide assistance to families in need. Opportunities include serving meals and helping maintain their garden, along with other programming, meal and tutoring aid for under-resourced children whose families visit the center.

Each year, GCU students, staff and faculty embark on global outreach trips in order to be in an environment where the Lord opens their heart to learn from and serve people of all nations. Mission trips vary in focus; some serve children, women and the homeless or focus on medical needs, while others focus on education, relationship building and labor-intensive construction projects. GCU provides opportunities for students to participate in both short trips and longer voyages in order to reap the benefits of multiple experiences while ministering abroad.



Travel reimbursement is only available to students who demonstrate their ability to meet admissibility for the traditional campus, plus one legal quardian, from a student's home city/state to Phoenix, AZ. School/district/ organizations staff, faculty and/or personnel are also eligible. To participate, the program requires a signed MOU by both the student and parent/quardian or personnel, approval of travel dates by GCU and receipts submitted per GCU requirements. Travel reimbursement thresholds vary based on location and education sector. Only one form of travel will be reimbursed, air or ground. GCU does not reimburse hotel expenses, baggage costs, early check-in or travel insurance fees. Travel reimbursement usually occurs within 45 days.





Grand Canyon University is accredited by the Higher Learning Commission (hlcommission.org), an institutional accreditation agency recognized by the U.S. Department of Education. Please note, not all GCU programs are available in all states and in all learning modalities. Program availability is contingent on student enrollment. Pre-licensure nursing students who begin or resume attendance in Fall 2020 and beyond will be ineligible to utilize most GCU institutional aid/scholarships for tuition and fees once accepted into the clinical portion of the program.
