#### ON-CAMPUS

Services are led collaboratively by student leaders, Spiritual Life staff and our campus pastor, and is open to all students, staff and faculty.

**THE GATHERING** is a weekly evening worship service led by student leaders with oversight from Spiritual Life staff. Students are invited to join their peers in community, prayer, worship and Bible teaching led by the GCU Pastoral Team.

**LIFE GROUPS** are student-led Bible studies for residential and commuter students. New students are especially encouraged to participate in Life Groups to meet friends and be encouraged with times of prayer and discussion. Students are welcome to join a Life Group any time throughout the year.

**SPIRITUAL FORMATION** programs exist to equip students with rhythms for life that make space for Christ to be formed in them, such as prayer, rest and engagement with scripture, workshops, cohorts and local retreats take place throughout the school year.

### **LOCAL OUTREACH MINISTRY**

Student leaders and staff from the Department of Spiritual Life organize a variety of annual and weekly outreach ministry events to serve and support GCU's surrounding community. **Here are just a few:** 

#### **CANYON KIDS**

Every Saturday morning, Canyon Kids invites the children in our neighborhood to a local church for Bible stories, games and crafts. Volunteers have the opportunity to mentor and form spiritual relationships with kids from the local community.

#### **CITYSERVE**

GCU has partnered with CityServe and its network of faith-based nonprofits, retailers, farmers and food suppliers to support families in need. Together, they have distributed over \$15.3 million in household goods to over 74,000 local families as of January 2025 from approximately 88,800 square feet of dedicated warehouse space on GCU's campus. GCU plans to expand its storage to roughly 100,000 square feet to increase its impact and reach more families.

#### **HABITAT FOR HUMANITY**

GCU is providing both the funding and manpower to renovate homes in the community through a partnership with Habitat for Humanity. Since 2015, more than \$6 million has been raised and more than 37,000 volunteer hours contributed to renovate 537 homes. Median home values have risen 842% in the 85017 zip code since 2011.<sup>1</sup>

'Travel reimbursement is only available to students who demonstrate their ability to meet admissibility for the traditional campus, plus one legal guardian, from a student's home city/state to Phoenix, Arizona. School/district/organization staff, faculty and/or personnel are also eligible. To participate, the program requires a signed MOU by both the student and parent/guardian or personnel, approval of travel dates by GCU and receipts submitted per GCU requirements. Travel reimbursement thresholds vary based on location and education sector. Only one form of travel will be reimbursed (air or ground). GCU does not reimburse hotel expenses, baggage costs, early check-in or travel insurance fees. Travel reimbursement usually occurs within 45 days.

Club sports are not regulated by the National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA), and do not have varsity status at the intercollegiate athletic level.
