Did you know? In addition to academic scholarships GCU offers scholarships designed to support students based on financial need including:



FINANCIAL SUPPORT SCHOLARSHIP¹

This scholarship program is available to first-time GCU students and is based upon Student Aid Index (SAI), as reported on your Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA®). Your score qualifies you for this additional award from Grand Canyon University and may change if your SAI adjusts. You may also be eligible for additional GCU institutional aid beyond this scholarship.

PELL GRANT MATCH SCHOLARSHIP²

This is a need-based scholarship granted to Pell eligible students living and attending classes on GCU's campus. This scholarship ensures your GCU institutional aid will be the same or more than the value of your Pell Grant and is renewable for up to eight total semesters unless your Pell Grant award changes.

¹MOU GTI769: This is a need-based scholarship program for eligible students with Student Aid Index (SAI) scores in the 5,001-40,000 range, as determined by completing the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) and submitting to GCU (School Code 001074). To be eligible, students must be entering GCU for the first time as either a high school student or transfer student and must have a minimum unweighted high school GPA of 3.0 or a 2.5 cumulative transfer college GPA. Eligible students may be able to receive this award in addition to other forms of GCU institutional aid. This scholarship is renewable for up to eight semesters and is subject to the University CAP policy.

² MOU GTI763.2: This scholarship ensures that the student's institutional aid package at GCU will, at minimum, match the value of the Pell Grant and is renewable for up to eight semesters if the student's Pell Grant continues to exceed the student's institutional aid package. This scholarship is subject to the university CAP policy. There are a limited number of scholarship awards available, therefore not all students who meet the qualifications will be awarded.

These scholarships are not secured until your Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) has been processed by GCU and does not require any further information. Students who do not secure their FAFSA information by the end of the add/drop period for the semester they begin coursework with GCU will forfeit this scholarship.
