





SHORT-TERM GLOBAL EDUCATION PROGRAMS

The Honors College offers international short-term global education programs for honors students to enhance their learning and exploration. Lately, we have explored England, France, Netherlands, Germany, Austria, Switzerland and Italy.

MISSION TRIPS WITH WELL-CHILD INTERNATIONAL

Honors College mission trips give students the life-changing opportunity to make an impact through service, such as teaching English, providing medical services and building relationships with locals in remote villages.

TRADITIONAL STUDY ABROAD

GCU partners with five prominent study abroad providers to offer students semesterlong, full-year and summer study abroad program opportunities that count as earned credit within their program of study.

SHORT-TERM FACULTY-LED PROGRAMS


Short-term faculty-led programs consist of cohorts of students guided by faculty in their field. Students have the option to earn academic credit by coordinating with their academic department, provided they meet the necessary criteria. Past programs have included a behavioral health program in London and an environmental science program in Costa Rica, offering immersive learning experiences led by experienced faculty.

GCU partners with two international internship providers to offer internships across a broad range of industries. Internships can span from four to 24 weeks and serve as a great option for students seeking professional and leadership development abroad.
