GCU CAP Policy: GCU academic scholarships and institutional aid may be combined up to the following limits:

- Chancellor/President Scholarship recipients in campus housing – up to \$15,000
- All other scholarship recipients in campus housing – up to \$12,500
- All scholarship recipients living off campus – up to \$10,000
- Micro-scholarships may not be combined with any other form of GCU-funded institutional aid or scholarships. Microscholarships may replace GCU institutional aid — up to \$6,000 per academic year. Athletic scholarships, Critical Mass scholarships and some student life leadership positions are not subject to the limits above (ASGCU and RA scholarships).

1 Qualified students must have graduated from a GCU CCSC participant school, be enrolled for 12 or more credit hours for each semester and be under the age of 21 by the start of their first semester at GCU. The scholarship awards \$4,000 per academic year to on-campus students who are admissible and \$1,500 per academic year to off-campus students. This award is renewable for each semester, as long as the student maintains continuous full-time enrollment, joins a campus worship service weekly and meets the 20-hour community service project requirement each semester (40 hours per academic year), upholds the ethical and moral values by which GCU stands and maintains admissibility with GCU. Recipients of the CCSC award are ineligible for the Grand Canyon State Scholarship. This scholarship is subject to the Grand Canyon University CAP policy and cannot exceed your charges. Award and award amounts are based on the 2021-22 award year.

2 The Chancellor award is the only scholarship level that requires an unweighted GPA for eligibility. There are a limited number of Chancellor awards and they are available on a first come, first-served basis.

3 If the student is admitted based on ACT or SAT, they will need a minimum unweighted high school GPA of 2.5 to be awarded the scholarship.

5 Based on suite-style, triple occupancy room plus the residence hall minimum meal plan (Canyon \$1,450 Dining Dollars per semester. Prices based on 2022-23 rate and are subject to change. Room and board charges are based on preliminary estimated costs for 2022-23 academic year.

6 Canyon connect fee is \$110 per course. The Canyon Connect fee is adjusted based on number of courses taken.

7 Student Activity Fee (Traditional campus students excluding students accepted into Pre-Licensure nursing program)

8 Parking fee is \$250 per academic year and charged in the fall semester. Students starting in the spring semester are charged a pro-rated fee of \$125.

9 Canyon Christian Schools Consortium (CCSC) Award – This program awards the following amounts to students who graduate from a CCSC participant school and are under the age of 21 by the first day of the student's first semester:

- \$4,000 per academic year to on-campus students
- \$1,500 per academic year to off-campus students.

Please note, not all GCU programs are available in all states and in all learning modalities. Program availability is contingent on student enrollment. Pre-licensure nursing students who begin or resume attendance in Fall 2020 and beyond will be ineligible to utilize most GCU institutional aid/scholarships for tuition and fees once accepted into the clinical portion of the program.
