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



Honors Lopes Score Big



HONORS GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

To graduate from the Honors College, students must complete the following curricular and co-curricular requirements, in addition to all the specific requirements of their degree program:

CURRICULAR (20-24 CREDITS)

- **Freshmen:** 24 total honors credits required
- **Transfers:** 20 total honors credits required
- Honors general education and major core courses available

CO-CURRICULAR

- A mandatory non-credit bearing symposia experience is required for first-year honors students; this includes incoming freshmen and transfer students.
- Must maintain a 3.25 GPA at GCU for continued enrollment in the Honors College




VOCATIONAL MISSION TRIPS ▲

- Admission into the university
