NEW STUDENT CLASSIFICATIONS

NEW STUDENT (AGES 17 - 19)

- A minimum of 17-years-old at the start of the academic term and under 20 years old on Dec. 31, 2023
- Registered as a full-time undergraduate student (12 or more credits, at least eight of which must be taken on campus)

NEW STUDENT (AGES 20-25)

- Be a minimum of 20-years-old by Dec. 31, 2023 and younger than 26-years-old at the start of the academic term
- Registered as a full-time undergraduate student (12 or more credits, at least eight of which must be taken on campus)





ON-CAMPUS HOUSING AT GCU

SUITE-STYLE LIVING OPTIONS:

SINGLE, DOUBLE AND TRIPLE OCCUPANCY

SINGLE OCCUPANCY SUITE-STYLE APARTMENTS

Student will have their own bedroom but will share a bathroom with one other student. Includes kitchen equipped with refrigerator, freezer, oven and electric range top and microwave.

SUITE-STYLE RESIDENCE HALLS - DOUBLE AND TRIPLE OCCUPANCY

Students share a bedroom and bathroom with one to two direct roommates and share the entire space with two to five suitemates, depending upon their occupancy selection. Double occupancy suites are shared by four students and triple occupancy suites are shared by six.

Room and board rates start at just \$3,550 per semester¹.

SUPPORT SERVICES

Resident Director

Resident directors (RDs) are full-time, professional live-in staff members who provide leadership and supervision for the resident assistants.

Resident Assistant¹

Resident assistants (RAs) are student leaders hand-picked by the Residence Life staff to serve in every living area to help foster community, create accountability for university living area policies and act as a resource to residential students.

Life Leader¹

Life leaders are students within each living area who serve as a resource, offering support and spiritual formation opportunities for residents.

Public Safety

Our Public Safety team is made up of real police officers and GCU Public Safety employees, including a large team of student workers. By working together, they provide assistance to students and ensure our campus is safe 24 hours a day, seven days a week.

Facilities

Our amazing facilities employees keep our large campus beautiful. Students are able to put in requests to the facilities department to repair anything in their room or suite that breaks throughout the year. Facilities employees also keep our classrooms and common areas clean.

Permit Pricing

Permit prices are for the whole school year. All parking is covered.

Parking garages: \$300¹

Motorcycle permits: \$150

If you will not be parking on campus for the entire year, you may request a partial parking fee refund.

¹ Parking fee is \$300 per academic year and charged in the fall semester. Students starting in the spring semester are charged a pro-rated fee of \$125. Motorcycles will be \$150 per academic year or \$75 per semester if prorated.
