GCU institutional scholarships are allowed to be combined up to the following limits:

- Chancellor/Chancellor-IB/President Scholarship recipients in campus housing – up to \$15,000
- All other scholarship recipients in campus housing – up to \$12,500
- All scholarship recipients living off campus – up to \$10,000
- Micro-scholarships may not be combined with any other form of GCU-funded institutional aid or scholarships. Micro-scholarships may replace GCU institutional aid not to exceed \$6,000 per academic year.

1 The Chancellor award is the only scholarship level that requires an unweighted GPA for eligibility. There are a limited number of Chancellor awards and they are available on a first come, first-served basis.  
 2 If the student is admitted based on ACT or SAT, they will need a minimum unweighted high school GPA of 2.5 to be awarded the scholarship.  
 3 If the student's test date was before March 1, 2016, please find more information on requirements at [gcu.edu/CampusScholarships](https://www.gcu.edu/CampusScholarships).  
 4 Based on suite-style, triple occupancy room plus the residence hall minimum meal plan (Canyon \$1,450 Dining Dollars per semester) Prices based on 2022-23 rate and are subject to change. Room and board charges are based on preliminary estimated costs for 2022-23 academic year.  
 5 Average fee estimate includes Canyon Connect book fees (six classes per academic year), activity fee, health fee and housing application fee. Parking fee is \$150 and will be collected in the fall, adjusted to \$75 for those attending spring only. Estimate not including Program Premium for majors such as nursing and engineering.  
 6 Canyon Christian Schools Consortium (CCSC) Award – This program awards the following amounts to students who graduate from a CCSC participant school and are under the age of 21 by the first day of the student's first semester:  
 • \$4,000 per academic year to on-campus students  
 • \$1,500 per academic year to off-campus students.  
 7 PRA awards shown are based on the student living on campus. A non-refundable \$50 registration deposit may be required if your tuition, fees and other expenses are not entirely covered by financial aid.  
 This award is stackable with other institutional aid and is renewable annually for up to eight semesters. Pre-licensure nursing students who begin or resume attendance in Fall 2020 and beyond will be ineligible to utilize most GCU institutional aid/scholarships for tuition and fees once accepted into the clinical portion of the program.
