# ABOUT GRAND CANYON UNIVERSITY

**Grand Canyon University is Arizona's premier, private Christian university. We help students find their purpose by offering next-generation education with 321 academic programs across nine distinct colleges. In Fall 2022, GCU had over 25,000 traditional students<sup>1</sup> on our vibrant campus in the heart of Phoenix.**

Spanning over 300 acres, GCU's campus continues to grow with new residence halls, academic buildings, popular eateries, student support resources and amenities, as well as athletic facilities like GCU Stadium, the Canyon Activity Complex and more. GCU has 30 labs available for use at no cost, featuring advanced equipment and dedicated faculty who work to ensure that our students experience hands-on learning from day one as freshmen.

## CAMPUS SCHOLARSHIPS

At Grand Canyon University, we offer generous scholarship opportunities to help make a private Christian education affordable. GCU's annual traditional campus tuition rate is \$16,500 for both in-state and out-of-state students. After GCU scholarships, the average traditional tuition is approximately \$8,700 for the 2021-22 academic year.

### **IN 2022, GCU'S CAMPUS STUDENTS RECEIVED OVER \$180 MILLION IN SCHOLARSHIPS.**

To maintain a GCU-funded institutional scholarship each year, students must be an admitted campus traditional undergraduate student and meet scholarship requirements. The following GCU-funded academic scholarships are renewable annually and can be locked in for up to four years for most programs. ## HIGH SCHOOL ACADEMIC SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

High school student scholarships are based on their weighted high school GPA. If they do not have a weighted GPA, they can apply their unweighted GPA (minimum of 2.5 GPA) plus ACT or SAT test score.

## INDIRECT ACADEMIC SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

### *Transfer, GAP Year and High School International F-1 Visa Students*

Students who are enrolling with GCU and are not eligible for the high school academic scholarship program (enrolled at GCU the semester following high school graduation), or students who are attending with an International F-1 Visa may be eligible for a transfer scholarship. A transfer scholarship is based on a student's unweighted high school GPA, their cumulative college transfer GPA if they have six or more college credits, or their ACT/SAT scores. ACT/SAT scores require a minimum 2.5 unweighted high school GPA.

<sup>1</sup> Travel reimbursement is only available to accepted prospective traditional campus students, plus one legal guardian, from a student's home city/state to Phoenix, AZ. School/district/organizations staff, faculty and/or personnel are also eligible. To participate, the program requires a signed MOU by both the student and parent/guardian or personnel, approval of travel dates by GCU and receipts submitted per GCU requirements. Travel reimbursement thresholds vary based on location and education sector. Only one form of travel will be reimbursed, air or ground. GCU does not reimburse hotel expenses, baggage costs, early check-in or travel insurance fees. Travel reimbursement usually occurs within 45 days.

Pre-licensure nursing students who begin or resume attendance in fall 2020 and beyond will be ineligible to utilize GCU institutional aid/scholarships for tuition and fees once accepted into the clinical portion of the program. Please note, not all GCU programs are available in all states and in all learning modalities. Program availability is contingent on student enrollment. Grand Canyon University is accredited by the Higher Learning Commission ([hlcommission.org](https://hlcommission.org)), an institutional accreditation agency recognized by the U.S. Department of Education.
