GCU'S CHAPTER of the <u>National Society of Collegiate Scholars</u> earned Diamond Status in 2022-23, an honor reserved for the single top performing chapter in the country.

THE HONORS COLLEGE celebrates the community engagement efforts, and crowning, of alumna <u>Adesuwa</u> Osayaren for serving as Miss Nations of the World in 2018, alumna <u>Jacqueline Thomas for serving as</u> <u>Miss Arizona in 2019</u>, Aubrey Grasz for serving as Miss Nebraska Volunteer in 2022 and <u>Faron Mehdi for serving</u> as <u>Miss Teen USA in 2022</u>.

DESPITE A DISRUPTION in global education during the COVID-19 pandemic, the Honors College still successfully deployed hundreds of students abroad since 2015 to engage in short-term global education programs, <u>mission trips</u>, <u>humanitarian outreach programs</u> and study abroad.



GCU PUBLISHED the first issue of the <u>Canyon Journal for Undergraduate</u> <u>Research (CJUR)</u> in 2023, featuring first-time student authors from the Honors College.

HONORS COLLEGE collaborates with GCU CityServe and Sleep in Heavenly Peace to build and deliver bunk beds for local families in need.

THE HONORS COLLEGE REMAINS committed to serving our local and global communities throughout the year. The college hosts an annual Canvas the Community Service Week campaign, which promotes community engagement and volunteerism with local non-profits, while coordinating and <u>executing various service projects</u> within and beyond this week of service.



THE HONORS COLLEGE <u>expanded leadership and professional development opportunities</u> to include: P.A.C. Professional Development Program, Young Athena Valley of the Sun Leadership Program, Pre-Health Medical and Graduate School Preparation Program, College-to-Corporate Leadership Academy, the Public Square Series for Civic Engagement, the RISE Fellowship and more.

COVID-19 DIDN'T slow down the Honors College's mission to serve. <u>Honors STEMists constructed</u> <u>wheelchairs</u> to donate to patients in need at the Neighborhood Christian Clinic, and <u>Honors VOICES</u> <u>assembled COVID care packages to support students in quarantine and self-care kits for frontline</u> <u>health care providers.</u>



HONORSSTUDENTS engaged in the Youth Assembly hosted by the United Nations in New York City, shared business solutions for impoverished regions at the <u>Clinton Global Initiative University</u>, presented scholarly work at various <u>academic conferences</u> and supported <u>TEDx GCU</u> on our home campus in Phoenix.
