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+ STUDENT LEADERSHIP

The student leadership application is open to current traditional freshmen, sophomores and juniors each January. Scholarships are awarded based upon distinct leadership responsibilities.

Once the application is live, students will log into their Student Portal to apply. Upon review, selected applicants will be invited to an interview or audition in February. Applicants who are chosen to serve as student leaders will be contacted in March and begin serving the following academic year.

200+ applicants will be chosen to serve as life leaders. Their responsibilities will include faithfully holding weekly Bible studies, making themselves available to other students for spiritual counsel and support while engaging in one-on-one mentoring relationships with head life leaders for training, discipleship and guidance.

180+ applicants will serve as Local or Global Outreach student leaders. Their responsibilities will include planning, developing, organizing and facilitating weekly ministry on and off-site.

30+ applicants will serve on the worship and production teams to lead worship for weekly Chapel, The Gathering and Sanctuary services.

10 applicants will serve on the spiritual formation team, programming opportunities such as weekly workshops, prayer gatherings and semester retreats for students to learn practical tools to grow in their faith.



+ CHAPEL, THE GATHERING AND SANCTUARY

Spiritual Life hosts three services where the GCU community gathers to worship together and hear teaching from the Bible. Musical worship is led by students from the worship team, while speakers consist of staff members and pastors from a variety of local churches and Christian organizations.
