ON-CAMPUS FACILITIES AND STUDENT RESOURCES

Our campus is equipped with modern facilities and diverse resources to support your educational journey. From the library to our labs, we're here to help you reach your academic goals. Here are some of the amenities available to you:

Canyon Worship: The Canyon Worship project is an annual initiative by the Center for Worship Arts, where GCU worship arts students create and release an original worship album, guided by experienced Christian professionals. Listen to our students' latest worship album at CanyonWorship.gcu.edu

Center for Worship Arts: GCU's Center for Worship Arts was built in 2015 to provide worship arts students with the opportunity to perform and lead exciting and transformative worship services among peers.

GCU CAM FAM Network: The **CAM FAM** connects students across disciplines like dance, music, theatre, design and film — helping you grow your community and creativity. Members gain access to events, collaborations, job opportunities, internships and other opportunities.

GCU Recording Studio: A **creative lab** where commercial music and worship arts majors and minors can bring musical ideas to life, mastering audio recording while collaborating with staff and artists. The studio supports singles, EPs or full albums and features WhisperRooms for recording, podcasting and related projects.

Music Facilities: Commercial music and worship arts students access professional studios and practice spaces, gaining practical experience. Facilities include 18 practice rooms and a rehearsal room with instrument storage, available first-come, first-served or by reservation.

Songwriters Lounge: A space for worship arts students to collaborate, write music, study and grow spiritually through group projects, Bible study and additional creative space.

The Grand Collective: A student-driven music project where worship arts students write, perform and produce a full-length EP of original music each year. Guided by industry professionals, students collaborate in a creative, faithcentered environment.

CLUBS AND ORGANIZATIONS

GCU SYMPHONIC BAND: During the basketball offseason, the Thundering Heard Pep Band becomes the GCU Symphonic Band and performs once a year.

GCU THUNDER BIG BAND: A high-caliber performing ensemble open to the most advanced jazz musicians by audition. This band studies and performs music from multiple music eras.

GCU PERCUSSION ENSEMBLE: A chamber music group open to percussionists of all majors by audition. This ensemble studies and performs contemporary music.

GCU WIND ENSEMBLE: The premiere wind group at GCU is open to the most advanced musicians by audition. Musical excellence is upheld as both new and traditional masterpieces are performed.





¹Travel reimbursement is only available to students who demonstrate their ability to meet admissibility for the traditional campus, plus one legal guardian, from a student's home city/state to Phoenix, AZ. School/district/organizations staff, faculty and/or personnel are also eligible. To participate, the program requires a signed MOU by both the student and parent/guardian or personnel, approval of travel dates by GCU and receipts submitted per GCU requirements. Travel reimbursement thresholds vary based on location and education sector. Only one form of travel will be reimbursed, air or ground. GCU does not reimburse hotel expenses, baggage costs, early check-in or travel insurance fees. Travel reimbursement usually occurs within 45 days.

Grand Canyon University is accredited by the Higher Learning Commission (HLCommission.org), an institutional accreditation agency recognized by the U.S. Department of Education.
