ENGAGE IN EXCITING RESEARCH

GCU has an emerging, vibrant undergraduate research culture. Student research is integrated into curricular and co-curricular activities to encourage hands-on, authentic research experience.

Examples of student research engagement include:

- **Publication of scholarly endeavors** in the peer-reviewed Canyon Journal of Undergraduate Research (CJUR).
- **Faculty-mentored, applied research experiences** in the Research and Design Program (RDP).
- **Discipline-specific, undergraduate capstone courses** in engineering, technology, social science and marketing.

PUT THEORY INTO PRACTICE

In partnership with our college deans, we have developed special learning environments, which we call Lopes Live Labs (L3s). These applied learning labs represent on-campus locations where you can gain access to industry opportunities and experience your education coming to life.

GCU is home to 52 L3s (as of September 2024) for use at no cost, featuring advanced equipment and dedicated faculty who work to ensure that our students experience hands-on learning. All GCU students — no matter their degree — are eligible to use the engineering and technology labs.¹

EXPERIENCE INTERDISCIPLINARY LEARNING FOR PRACTICAL APPLICATIONS

At GCU, most courses are designed as four-credit classes, allowing students an opportunity to learn academic subjects through an approach that integrates and combines knowledge and insights from different disciplines. This approach encourages collaboration across fields of study. As a result, while students ultimately take fewer courses throughout their degree program and still meet the required seat time, GCU students should be able to draw knowledge from several areas, replicating how innovations and problems appear in the workplace. GCU adopted this model because the university understands that no subject is finite in its application outside the classroom.

EDUCATION MEETS AFFORDABILITY

On average, traditional campus students in 2024-25 qualified for approximately **\$7,300 in GCU-funded scholarships** for the academic year, which reduced tuition by almost half to \$9,100.¹

At GCU, our number one priority is our students. To ensure you receive a quality education affordably, we do everything in our power to further reduce costs, including offering the same tuition rate for both in- and out-of-state students.

FINANCIAL TRANSPARENCY AND DEBT MINIMIZATION

At our university, we are committed to financial transparency and helping you minimize your debt. Our admissions counselors work to provide a clear financial picture regarding your loans, scholarships and tuition. We offer tailored financial solutions and interest-free payment plans to ensure that you can graduate with minimal debt, starting with transparent financial discussions.

As of the 2024-25 academic year, GCU has kept its campus tuition at the same rate for 16 years, holding rates steady since 2009.

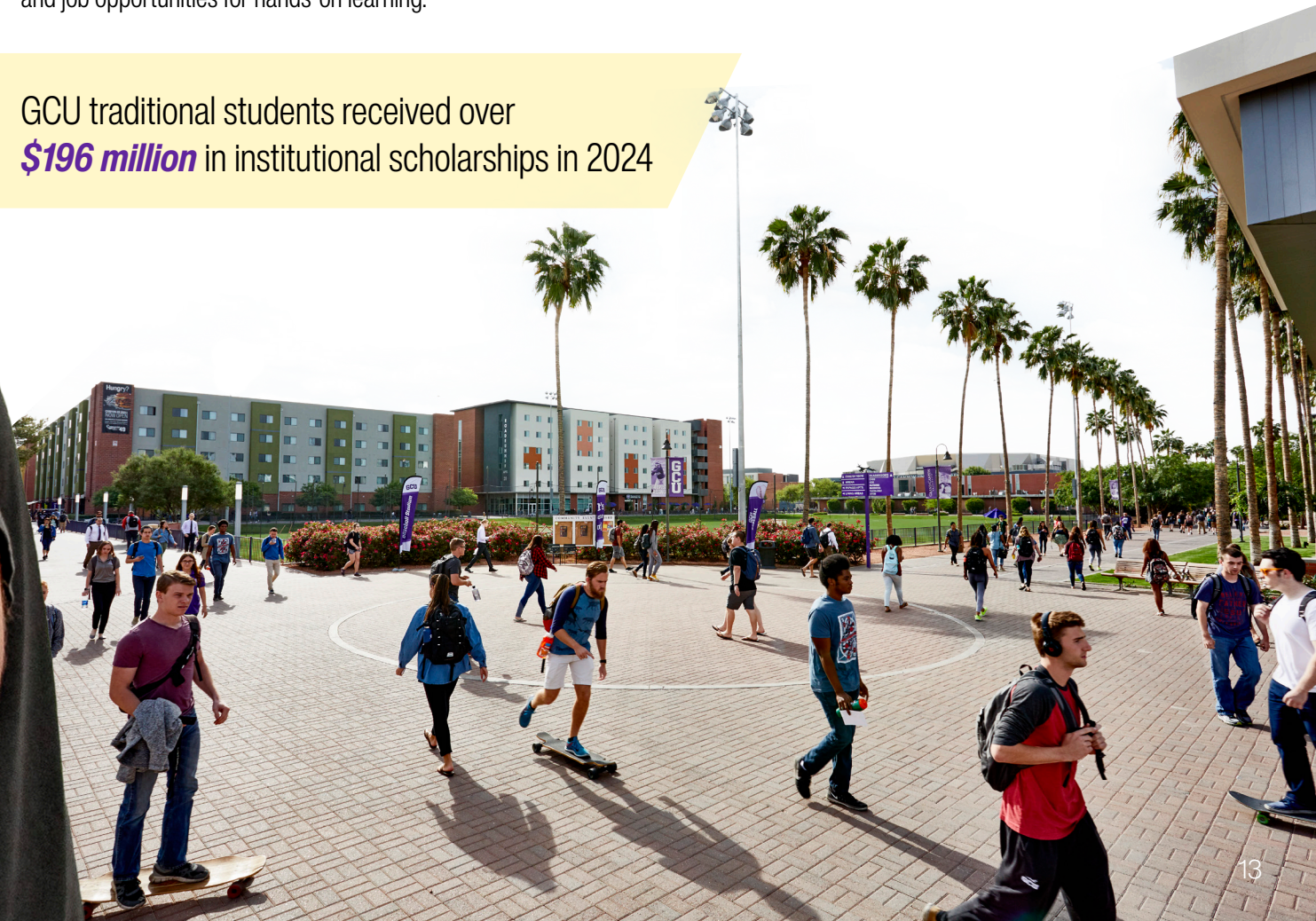
MAXIMIZE TIME AT GCU

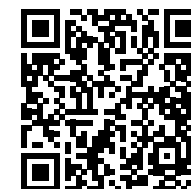
ACADEMIC SUPPORT

LOCAL AND GLOBAL OUTREACH

Student leaders and staff from the Department of Spiritual Life organize a variety of annual and weekly outreach ministry events to serve and support GCU's surrounding community. *Here are just a few:*

- **GCU CITYSERVE** has partnered with CityServe and its network of faith-based nonprofits, retailers, farmers and food suppliers to support families in need. Together, they have distributed over \$15.3 million in household goods to over 74,000 local families as of January 2025 from approximately 88,800 square feet of dedicated warehouse space on GCU's campus. GCU plans to expand its storage to roughly 100,000 square feet to increase its impact and reach more families. - **CANYON KIDS** Our students host children from the surrounding neighborhood in Little Canyon Park and Cielito Park for Bible stories, games, crafts and more. These volunteers mentor and bring joy to these children to help create a safe environment.
- **HABITAT FOR HUMANITY** Since 2015, GCU has partnered with Habitat for Humanity, a nonprofit Christian housing ministry that builds and repairs houses all over the world for underprivileged people, to renovate an entire community of homes in our West Phoenix neighborhood.
- **HOMELESS MINISTRY** GCU has partnered with St. Vincent de Paul to provide assistance to families in need. Opportunities include serving meals and helping maintain the garden at the facility, along with other programs and tutoring aid for under-resourced children whose families visit the center.

INTERNATIONAL MISSION TRIPS

Our global mission trips are opportunities to travel abroad, engage in ministry as a team and learn from other cultures. The Spiritual Life Department hosts a missions fair in the fall where students can connect with organizations.

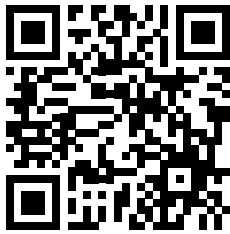
