SHORT-TERM GLOBAL STUDIES PROGRAMS

The Honors College offers international short-term global studies programs for honors students to enhance their learning and exploration. Students can embark on adventures around the globe to discover new countries, experience different cultures, see incredible sights and learn about famous landmarks.

TRADITIONAL STUDY ABROAD

GCU partners with five prominent study abroad providers and one international internship provider to offer students exciting study abroad program opportunities that count as earned credit within their program of study. These semester-long, full-year and summer experiences are at approved foreign universities and companies worldwide.

LIVING AND LEARNING INTERNATIONAL

Looking to study abroad with a group of honors peers? The Honors College supports cohorts of students in semester-long programs in Quito, Ecuador; Rome, Italy and a study-away program in Baltimore, Maryland. Earn up to 20 transferrable college credits, intern within your desired industry and experience Christian fellowship within the community.

MISSION PROGRAMS WITH WELL CHILD INTERNATIONAL

Honors students can travel internationally as part of a missions team to make a difference. GCU global outreach trips give students the life-changing opportunity to make an impact through service, social work and more, from teaching English through ministry partnerships to building relationships with locals in remote villages. Our mission trips for honors students are also a fantastic opportunity to experience service within various professional industries.

INTERNATIONAL INTERNSHIPS

GCU partners with The Intern Group to offer international internship opportunities around the globe ranging from four to 12 weeks in length. Students work alongside international industry experts while also engaging in professional development, leadership training and cultural immersion experiences. Internships are available in most industries, including STEM, health care, education, nonprofit, marketing, hospitality and more. Best of all, you can earn college credit for your internship experience.



RESEARCH **OPPORTUNITIES**

GCU's flourishing research community brings together faculty scholars, emerging doctoral researchers, industry partners and collaborative undergraduate research teams. We support faculty scholarship across all disciplines, with a special focus on fostering teaching excellence and mentoring student curiosity. This integrated approach highlights our commitment to enhancing student learning while advancing our growing scholarly community.

RESEARCH DESIGN PROGRAM

The GCU Research and Design Program (RDP) offers hands-on, mentored training and learning experiences for students studying in the science, engineering or technology field. Although it is not required to major in one of these fields, honors students are strongly encouraged to apply for these research opportunities as early as freshman year. In this program, students are expected to contribute directly to current research and design projects led by faculty while learning various research techniques and methodologies. Students can present both locally and on larger platforms across the country.

CANYON JOURNAL OF UNDERGRADUATE RESEARCH

The Canyon Journal of Undergraduate Research (CJUR) is dedicated to the publication of exemplary faculty-mentored and peer-reviewed research produced by undergraduate students at GCU. The CJUR is multidisciplinary with original, contemporary research in alignment with the Boyer Model of Scholarship.

Honors College students have access to HON-355: Academic Journal Writing, an interactive, workshop-style course supported by a faculty mentor to coach students on preparing for the publication process.

CANYON UNDERGRADUATE RESEARCH CONFERENCE

The Honors College hosts this multidisciplinary academic conference annually, offering students a platform to share about research, project or community engagement experiences through a poster presentation display, oral presentation or capstone project. This conference welcomes our community and industry partners, employers and the entire academic community to experience this profound display of academic excellence.

HONORS SHOWCASE

Honors students can present their research and projects to a panel of industry experts and judges for the opportunity to earn scholarship funding for the following academic year.

¹ Travel reimbursement is only available to students who demonstrate their ability to meet admissibility for the traditional campus, plus one legal guardian, from a student's home city/state to Phoenix, Arizona. School/district/organization staff, faculty and/or personnel are also eligible. To participate, the program requires a signed MOU by both the student and parent/guardian or personnel, approval of travel dates by GCU and receipts submitted per GCU requirements. Travel reimbursement thresholds vary based on location and education sector. Only one form of travel will be reimbursed (air or ground). GCU does not reimburse hotel expenses, baggage costs, early check-in or travel insurance fees. Travel reimbursement usually occurs within 45 days.

Grand Canyon University is accredited by the Higher Learning Commission (HLCommission.org), an institutional accreditation agency recognized by the U.S. Department of Education.
