WHAT'S INCLUDED?

- This scholarship covers tuition and fees at GCU, after grants, outside scholarships² and all other GCU institutional aid is applied.
- This award does not cover parking fees, health insurance premiums, food (dining dollars) and housing expenses.

This scholarship is automatically renewable for up to eight semesters as long as participating students continue to meet the requirements.

GET STARTED:

- APPLY at <u>gcu.edu/ApplyNow</u>. No application fee!
- SUBMIT your high school transcripts.
- MEET with your university admissions counselor to review the eligibility requirements.
- COMPLETE the FAFSA to confirm your eligibility: GCU's school code is 001074.
- REGISTER for courses and begin your degree program at GCU.

QUALIFICATIONS:

- Must qualify to receive the maximum Pell Grant amount as determined by completing the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)
- Minimum 3.0 unweighted high school GPA
- Must be a graduating senior from an Arizona high school
- Must be an incoming high school senior starting in the Fall 2025-26 academic year

¹ This is a need-based scholarship program for eligible Arizona high school students entering GCU for the first time. To be eligible, students must qualify to receive the maximum Pell Grant amount as determined by completing the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) and submitting to GCU (School Code 01074). Students must also have a minimum of a 3.0 unweighted high school GPA. This scholarship covers the remaining cost, after the Pell Grant award and all other GCU institutional aid is applied, to attend GCU for tuition and fees. This award does not cover parking fees, health insurance premiums, food (Dining Dollars) and housing expenses. This scholarship is renewable for up to eight semesters so long as you maintain maximum Pell Grant award eligibility and remain admissible with GCU. ² Students who receive outside scholarship or aid not awarded by GCU can apply their outside scholarship aid to their food and housing charges. If there are no food and housing charges to apply to, the outside aid will reduce the amount of the Canyon Rising award.
