

GCU'S DUAL ENROLLMENT PRE-NURSING PATHWAY

Already passionate about health care? Get a head start on your degree. Still exploring your options? Grand Canyon University's prenursing pathway lets you experience nursing and health care courses before committing to a college program.

These online, seven or 15-week courses are designed to allow you the opportunity to complete all pre-nursing general education and prerequisite courses at a low tuition rate while in high school. This can potentially save you time and money while helping you build a strong academic foundation before starting college!

Qualified students who complete this pathway may be able to finish their last set of courses as a freshman in the fall semester, allowing them to enter either the Bachelor of Science in Nursing: Pre-Licensure program on campus or the accelerated BSN: Pre-Licensure program at one of our locations as freshman in the spring semester.
