

Bachelor of Science in Behavioral Health Science: Pursue your behavioral health science degree to study counseling theories, explore treatments for addiction and substance use disorders and examine group dynamics. Courses include human development, abnormal psychology and probability and statistics.

Bachelor of Science in Psychology: In this undergraduate program, you'll have the opportunity to develop critical reasoning and analytical skills, refine your communication abilities and explore what it means to bring Christian principles to the professional space. As you examine human behaviors and patterns of thinking, you'll also be able to learn best practices in research, including scientific observation, data collection and analysis.

Bachelor of Social Work: The BSW courses explore human behavior in the social environment, analyzing biopsychosocial development from conception to late adulthood through a multidimensional perspective. You'll learn and practice skills in engagement, assessment, treatment, evaluation and termination, helping prepare you to make an impact on individuals, families, communities and organizations.

## CENTER FOR INNOVATION IN RESEARCH AND TEACHING (CIRT)

This faculty-driven organization supports the development of creativity, critical thinking and learning in a wide range of disciplines in order to create an integrated community of educators. CIRT publishes in the Journal of Institutional Research (JIR) online once each year. JIR helps enhance scholarly understanding and application of best practices in college teaching.

### EXAMINING POSITIVE PSYCHOLOGY IN COMMUNITIES (E.P.I.C. LAB)

This lab applies Dr. Martin Seligman's principles of positive psychology to foster human flourishing. Research focuses on resilience, mindfulness, coping strategies and self-efficacy, combining basic and applied psychology. Project examples include evaluating a Trauma-Informed Care program aimed to enhance resilience and reduce substance use among adolescents, promoting community wellness across Arizona.



<sup>1</sup>Travel reimbursement is only available to students who demonstrate their ability to meet admissibility for the traditional campus, plus one legal guardian, from a student's home city/state to Phoenix, AZ. School/district/organizations staff, faculty and/or personnel are also eligible. To participate, the program requires a signed MOU by both the student and parent/guardian or personnel, approval of travel dates by GCU and receipts submitted per GCU requirements. Travel reimbursement thresholds vary based on location and education sector. Only one form of travel will be reimbursed, air or ground. GCU does not reimburse hotel expenses, baggage costs, early check-in or travel insurance fees. Travel reimbursement usually occurs within 45 days.

Grand Canyon University is accredited by the Higher Learning Commission (HLCommission.org), an institutional accreditation agency recognized by the U.S. Department of Education.
